RIPTA TO RUN HOLIDAY SERVICE SCHEDULE ON SUNDAY, DECEMBER 25, 2022 AND SUNDAY, JANUARY 1, 2023

RIPTA will operate all regular fixed-route bus service on a Sunday/Holiday schedule on Sunday, December 25, 2022 in observance of Christmas Day and Sunday, January 1, 2023 in observance of New Year's Day. RIPTA offices will be closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. All RIPTA Offices, except for the Customer Service Call Center, will be closed on Monday, December 26 and Monday, January 2. Also, the Flex Service reservation line (1-877-906-FLEX) and the RIdle reservation line (461-9760) will not be staffed on either holiday.

DOCUMENTARY SHOWS HOW TRANSIT SHAPED EDGEWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD



History and transit aficionados alike can now view an independent documentary that shows how the location of a trolley line at the turn of the century created the gracious Edgewood neighborhood in Cranston. The story is told in an independent film, called *END OF THE LINE: The Tracks That Shaped Our RI Streetcar Suburb*, [featured here](#). RIPTA is not affiliated with the film that was created by filmmaker and anthropologist David A. Goldenberg.

“This documentary provides an insightful and engaging look at how trolleys and streetcars shaped the growth of the Edgewood neighborhood and is a reminder that public transportation still plays a key role in where people choose to live and where businesses can flourish in our State,” said Scott Avedisian, RIPTA’s Chief Executive Officer. “It also contains many entertaining details of life in Rhode Island at the turn of the century.”

Goldenberg, who lives in Edgewood along the old trolley line, said the project was a labor of love that occurred by happenstance. He has made dozens of documentaries but wasn’t necessarily looking for a new project when he spied the rails in the potholes that caused traffic to rattle and shake when it passed his home.

“Clearly, electrified mass transit transformed this area,” said Barbara Rubine, President of the [Edgewood Waterfront Protection Association](#). “What was a mix of farms and resort destinations became a vibrant upper middle-class commuter community.”

RHODE ISLAND PARTNERS PREPARING TO IMPLEMENT VEHICLE SHARING PILOT PROJECT

The [National Aging and Disability Transportation Center \(NADTC\)](#) recently awarded [Age-Friendly Rhode Island](#) with

a \$70,000 grant for a pilot project planned in partnership with RIPTA and [Looking Upwards](#), a nonprofit agency that offers a wide array of services to adults with developmental disabilities and children and youth with special healthcare needs. Nine agencies around the country, including Age-Friendly Rhode Island, received planning grants in 2021, and seven of those agencies are now slated to receive funds for implementation, totaling \$490,000. The Rhode Island pilot will involve developing a vehicle sharing program utilizing one of Looking Upwards' vans to serve older adults, people with disabilities, and marginalized groups in Newport County who have unmet transportation needs. Joelle Kanter, Planner, Human Services Transportation

Joelle Kanter started her career over two decades ago working with business improvement districts in New Jersey, before moving to Rhode Island in 2005 to work at The Providence Foundation in partnership with the Providence Downtown Improvement District. After collaborating with RIPTA on several projects, she finally joined our transit team in the RIPTA's Planning Department, focusing on Human Services Transportation Planning.



Today, Joelle is responsible for managing grant programs, plans, and meetings related to individuals with disabilities, older adults, and people with low incomes. Joelle closely works with [Accessible Transportation Advisory Committee \(ATAC\)](#) members, learning about their experiences using both paratransit and fixed-route services so that RIPTA can help serve them better. She also provides leadership for the statewide Human Services Transportation Coordinating Council, whose vision is accessible, coordinated statewide mobility for all Rhode Islanders.

"After working for small organizations for years, it's been fun to work at a large agency with so many moving parts. I love collaborating with people in other departments on projects that really matter," said Joelle. "My colleagues at RIPTA are bright and motivated, and we have a unique opportunity to do impactful work across the state."
