## A MESSAGE FROM THE RIPTA INTERIM CEO

Earlier this year, the Authority held public meetings on potential service reductions to better align schedules with available personnel. When the Board of Directors appointed me as Interim CEO

while they conduct a search and determine the direction of the agency, I was immediately faced with the difficult decision on whether those service reductions should be adopted or not.

Having listened to much public testimony and hearing from the staff, we set out on a different course of action. To be clear, the resource gap was real, and we saw a significant amount of service being lost due to not having the operators to run the schedule. However, the proposed changes would eliminate mobility options altogether for many riders.

After consulting with staff and the Board of Directors, we ultimately felt it was better to cancel the proposed cuts and instead work to spread the impact of lost trips. Simultaneously, we would restructure our recruitment and training programs to take advantage of increased applications thanks to a higher starting wage for paratransit operators.

Over the course of this summer, the entire RIPTA team worked hard to cover as much service as possible, onboard as many employees as possible, and train as many operators as possible. We've been able to hire over 30 drivers and can now say that we are covering all service and have been for several weeks now.

We have much work to do, but we have a solid foundation in place to continue hiring and working to improve service. I'm thankful for the patience and support of riders, stakeholders, the RIPTA Board of Directors, and of course, our fantastic team at RIPTA.

We look forward to delivering even more improvements in the months ahead. I thank you all for your continued support.



#### Toast to a Transit Triumph: CCRI Bus Stop Enhancement Project Completed!

Governor McKee, members of the state's Congressional delegation and General Assembly, municipal leaders, and RIPTA officials gathered last month to celebrate the completion of the \$1.8 Million Bus Stop Enhancement Project at the Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI) Knight Campus in Warwick. This project, a collaborative effort between RIPTA and CCRI, is a significant step in improving transit accessibility and enhancing the rider experience as recommended in Rhode Island's 2020 statewide Transit Master Plan, Transit Forward Rhode Island.

"These significant bus stop enhancements at CCRI set a new standard for transit infrastructure, and it will serve as a blueprint for future projects like this across the state," said Christopher Durand, RIPTA interim Chief Executive Officer. <u>East Side Tunnel Closure:</u> Now through October 2024 ● Routes 1, 32, 33, 34, 40 and 61x are on detour through mid-October.

West River Street Bridge Detour: Now through November 2024 ● Route 58 is on detour through November due to the West River Street Bridge Replacement Project.

Gloria Gemma Flames of Hope: Thursday, October 3 - Sunday, October 6 • Routes 50, 55, 56 and 57 will be on detour beginning Thursday, October 3 at 7am until 6pm on Sunday, October 6.
